





Recruitment to speciality training

- Speciality Specific Guidance for Portfolio route applicants (previously CESR)
- Curriculum
- Course funding



- > National expansion in training posts number since 2021
- Vacancies across training schemes in round 1 National Recruitment
- > 2022: 88 vacant posts; 78% fill rate in Round 1
- > 2023: 91vacant posts; 50.5% fill rate in Round 1
- Reduction in fill rates across medical specialities and mirrored in clinical oncology
- Need for Round 2
- Promotion of Medical Oncology as a career

NATIONAL RECRUITMENT 2023

- Recruitment Lead and ACP Trainees ran a Medical Oncology Careers Webinar in July 2023
- > Advertised at localities and through the RCP to IMT trainees
- > 200 registered, approximately 130? Attended, very well received
- > Round 2: 35 posts declared, 50-55 candidates invited to interview
- ► 10/10/2023
- Discussions regarding engaging medical students, Foundation doctors and IMT trainees in Medical Oncology and Oncology Careers

NATIONAL RECRUITMENT 2023

- New legislation from 30/11/2023 changing the way that doctors are assessed to go onto the specialist register
- > GMC requested updates to all SSG from all colleges
- Focus on the knowledge, skills and experience that are required to go onto the specialist register rather than the route that the applicant has taken
- > Increased flexibility

UPDATE TO THE SPECIALITY SPECIFIC GUIDANCE (SSG) FOR PORTFOLIO ROUTE TO SPECIALIST REGISTER (FORMERLEY CESR)

- Reviewed within SAC
- > Aligned with the Capabilities in Practice in the 2021 curriculum
- Slightly reduced the burden of evidence required (5 years)
- Clarity for applicants on how to evidence the capabilities
- Structured reports and MCRs
- Submitted to the GMC with responses to queries in advance of the 30/09/23 deadline.
- > Awaiting a response

SSG UPDATE

Report submitted to the GMC regarding implementation of the first year of the revised curriculum

- > Positive response from the GMC regarding implementation
- > Curriculum is now on a 4 year rolling program of review
- Reduced threat of changing to a group 1 speciality with training in internal medicine for now

2021 CURRICULUM

- System changed in 2018
 - previously set allocation per trainee per year; trainees topped this up
 - now individualised to trainee educational needs
- Ongoing struggle to fund especially the MSc-type Oncology courses provided in various parts of the country
 - MSc badge always seen as 'aspirational' even where these were developed specifically to provide core curriculum directed training
 - ▶ high unit cost (notional budget allocation per trainee ~£6-700/year)
- In negotiations with HEE/CopMed about this
 - high unit cost should be looked at in context of overall costs as per their policy
 - explore option for part-funding currently not possible
 - likely that this will all be devolved to regional training days supplemented by shorter/cheaper/ more targeted courses that come closer to their notional allocation

Closer Working between Medical Oncology and Clinical Oncology – Update on Report and Recommendations of the CWG

Since 2019, Working Groups from the ACP, the RCPs and the RCR have explored the benefits - to patients, the NHS and to clinicians – of closer working between the two specialties of Clinical Oncology and Medical Oncology.

After wide ranging analysis and consultations, they concluded that the best eventual solution would be for Clinical Oncology and Medical Oncology – remaining as two separate specialties - to form a new Joint Faculty, hosted within the RCR. However, detailed investigation of current financial, operational and governance issues suggests that this cannot be done now.

They recommended that Clinical Oncology and Medical Oncology should establish a joint committee to develop plans for closer working in several key areas including policy, strategy, training and workforce development. They should work towards a Joint Faculty when it becomes possible to do so. The Working Groups have agreed a template for such a Faculty.

The above process and recommendations are set out in a <u>Report and</u> <u>Recommendations of the Clinical Oncology and Medical Oncology</u> <u>Closer Working Group</u>. Closer Working between Medical Oncology and Clinical Oncology – The Next Steps

- explore ways in which the two specialties could collaborate more effectively on shared aims and issues of mutual interest, and
- establish how such joint working could best be achieved, in fulfilment of the CWG's recommendation for "a committee of CO and MO to take forward Closer Working, the implementation of these recommendations and proposals on the key issues identified in this report".

Proposed Working arrangements

It was agreed that there should be a small Executive Group comprising:

- the RCR's CO Officers Dr Roques, Dr Thorp and Dr Hanna and
- core members of the ACP Executive Committee Prof Wardley, Dr Graham Dark (Vice-Chair), Prof Samreen Ahmed (Honorary Secretary) and Dr Jagdev

The new Group should meet regularly, once every 2 months to begin with. Meetings would be held online and for no longer than 1.5 hours initially, reducing to 1 hour when the Group had become established.
