

Melanoma Institute Australia Medical & Immuno Oncology Fellowships

Melanoma Institute Australia (MIA) has one full-time Fellowship position for a medical oncology trainee. This Fellowship will start late January 2020 and be for one year in duration. You must either be an Medical Oncology Trainee or recently qualified RACP Fellow in Medical Oncology (or overseas equivalent).

This position will provide a unique opportunity for the right individual to obtain training in the treatment and care of melanoma and complex skin cancer patients in a multi - disciplinary, clinical and translational research environment, with an emphasis on management of patients on Ph I, II, III clinical trials, treated with novel targeted and immune therapies.

MIA is an independent, non-profit research institute located in North Sydney (NSW, Australia). The Institute is formally affiliated with the University of Sydney and collaborates with clinicians at Royal Prince Alfred Hospital, Royal North Shore Hospital, Westmead Hospital and St Vincent's and Mater Health to improve the outcome of patients with complex skin cancer. Our team of medical oncologists sees approximately 500 new patients each year and lead a large number of clinical trials of novel agents, including investigator initiated clinical and translational studies. The Institute has become a major referral centre in Australia, and the care and research conducted by the Institute is widely regarded as world-class.

This position is based at MIA in North Sydney and will enable the successful applicants to work within a dynamic and high volume multidisciplinary team focused on the treatment of melanoma, with research links to Westmead Hospital, Royal Prince Alfred and Royal North Shore Hospital. These positions offer an ideal opportunity to the right candidates to work alongside leading medical oncologists, Professor Georgina Long and Associate Professor Alex Menzies to receive training in the care of melanoma patients, gain expertise in the use of immunotherapy and targeted therapy, gain a detailed understanding in the conduct of clinical trials, as well as gain exposure to world-leading clinical and translational research programs.

This position will involve participation in outpatient multidisciplinary melanoma care, strong involvement in the conduct and medical oversight of medical oncology clinical trials, and the conduct of clinical research programs. The fellow will be expected to participate in the academic activities of the Institute, including conducting research projects for presentation at a major international conferences and publication in high ranking journals. Opportunity for part-time postgraduate study for a Masters through The University of Sydney is available, as is the potential to transfer after completion of the fellowship into a full-time PhD at the University of Sydney or Macquarie University.

Applicants need to hold a FRACP part 1 and 2 exam or equivalent, be eligible for registration with the Medical Board of Australia; and have completed (or will have by January 2020) at least 2 core years of advanced training in medical oncology. Priority is given to Australian candidates. For UK applicants you will need to have at least MRCP Part 2 (with PACES preferred) and have equivalent clinical experience at registrar/SHO level in Medical Oncology.
